It is a delight to welcome Shelly Rambo as our guest preacher for the morning. Shelly is Associate Professor of Theology at Boston University School of Theology. She is author of Spirit and Trauma: A Theology of Remaining (Westminster John Knox, 2010) and the co-edited volume, Post-Traumatic Public Theology (Palgrave MacMillan, 2016), which reflects ongoing commitments to strengthening the capacities of religious leaders to respond to violence and trauma. Her forthcoming book, Resurrecting Wounds: Living in the Afterlife of Trauma (Baylor University Press, 2017) examines the figure of resurrection wounds as it meets contemporary expressions of post-traumatic life.

This week we're honored to welcome Julius Kyakuwa back to Old Lyme. Many of us got to know Julius last year when he visited with the University of Pretorius African Ensemble. Born in Uganda, East Africa, Julius Kyakuwa is a PhD graduate student of Music Education at Louisiana State University (LSU). He recently moved from South Africa in 2016 where he was a Music Education Master's student at the University Pretoria. He was also an African and World music part time lecturer, and also artistic director of UP OVUWA the University of Pretoria's African Ensemble. As a music educator, African folklorist, story teller, and orator, Julius is a master African drummer, percussionist, and a versatile performer on several African indigenous instruments.

From the Jordan to the Sea: Israel-Palestine in Film

Thursday nights at 7:00 pm | from *April 27 – May 18, 2017*

These films offer a human face to the relationship between Israelis and Palestinians in the land between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean Sea. The film series strives to educate and inspire dialogue. The films offer different perspectives not often seen or discussed in our area. We hope to raise questions, challenge some common myths and jumpstart candid discussion about the complexities of working for peace and justice in the Middle East and in our own country as well.

When I Saw You | Thursday April 27 – 7:00 pm

It is 1967. The world is alive with change: brimming with reawakened energy, new styles, music and an infectious sense of hope. In Jordan, a different kind of change is underway as tens of thousands of refugees pour across the border from Palestine. Having been separated from his father in the chaos of war, Tarek, 11, and his mother, Ghaydaa, are amongst this latest wave of refugees. Placed in “temporary” refugee camps until they would be able to return, they wait, like the generation before them who arrived in 1948. With difficulties adjusting to life in Harir camp and a longing to be reunited with his father, Tarek searches a way out, and discovers a new hope emerging with the times. The film is the story of people affected by the times around them, searching for something more and yearning to be free. A story of the human spirit that knows no borders.
