**Ladies’ Benevolent Society Luncheon on May 9th!** Get ready for Memorial Day with a festival of popular song from WWI and WWII. On *Tuesday, May 9th, at 12:00 pm* enjoy *Songs from the Homefront*, a festival of popular song from WW I and WW II with performer and historian Faye Ringel. She will accompany herself on the piano, and encourages luncheon participants to sing along on some of the more familiar tunes (aided by song-sheets provided). Faye Ringel, Ph.D., Professor Emerita of English, U.S. Coast Guard Academy, is the author of *New England's Gothic Literature: Folklore and History of the Supernatural* and many articles in reference books and scholarly journals. A lifelong resident of Eastern Connecticut, she is active in music and theater. She plays keyboard and sings with the traditional Klezmer band Klezmenschen and performs musical and historical programs for libraries, senior centers, and other organizations. ## **Tree of Life Film series at the Westbrook Public Library**

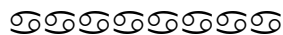
### **From the Jordan to the Sea: Israel-Palestine in Film**

Thursday nights at 7:00 pm | from *April 27 – May 18, 2017*

**These films offer a human face to the relationship between Israelis and Palestinians in the land between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean Sea.** The film series strives to educate and inspire dialogue. The films offer different perspectives not often seen or discussed in our area. We hope to raise questions, challenge some common myths and jumpstart candid discussion about the complexities of working for peace and justice in the Middle East and in our own country as well.

### ***Five Broken Cameras (2011) | Thursday May 4 – 7:00 pm***

A documentary film co-directed by Palestinian Emad Burnat and Israeli Guy Davidii. It is a firsthand account of protests in Bil'in, a West Bank village affected by the Israel West Bank barrier. The documentary was shot almost entirely by the Palestinian farmer who bought his first camera in 2005 to record the birth of his youngest son. Structured around the destruction of Burnat's cameras, it follows one family's evolution over five years of turmoil. The film won a 2012 Sundance Film Festival award, and was nominated for a 2013 Academy Award.
