Church World Service Blanket Drive During February and March, the Ladies Benevolent Society collects the annual offering for the Blanket Drive. CWS has been around for 60 years and has provided blankets and other services to a multitude of people all over the world. Blankets are distributed to people when they lose power, to the homeless and economically disadvantaged, to newly arrived refugees and people affected by hurricanes, flooding, tornadoes or fires. CWS supports blanket purchases closer to the area where they will be distributed, which saves processing and shipping and supports the local economy. Each blanket costs \$10.
