# Mission Outreach at The First Congregational Church of Old Lyme in 2022

This evening's offering will be used to support the Minister's Discretionary Fund of the First Congregational Church. This fund is used to support individuals and families in need. Over the course of the past year this fund has dispersed a little over \$30,000. It is supported by this church's annual budget, by occasional special donations in memory of a loved one, and, **most importantly**, by the annual Christmas Eve collection. We ask that you give as generously as you can.

The past several years have been very challenging in many ways. Many families have endured unprecedented hardships. And some of the organizations which our community has traditionally supported have endured through financial struggles as well. But the extraordinary generosity of this congregation has made it possible for our Board of Missions to continue to offer courageous support within our region and throughout some of the most critically needy parts of the world. As of tonight, the Board of Missions has released \$72,000 already this year. And they anticipate further gifts in the next few weeks.

Our Ladies Benevolent Society donated an additional \$51,000 to agencies in this region. This money is raised mainly through their annual White Elephant Sale; a courageous undertaking that gathers in many volunteers (as well as donors) throughout our community.

Additionally, in 2022, special gifts totaling more than \$143,000 were made by our members and friends to our refugee work, our immigration assistance program, the Witness Stones Project in the town of Old Lyme, our monthly diaper bank initiative, and the Ministers' Discretionary Fund. Included in that total was a remarkable gift of over \$29,000 to the people of Ukraine, administered through the International Rescue Committee in New York.

Thus, in total for the year 2022, over \$290,000 in aid and support was made possible through the generosity of the people of this church.

Our offering this evening will go to the Ministers' Discretionary Fund, used locally to assist those in need with housing, food, fuel and special medical assistance. We ask that you give generously.

### **Ministers' Discretionary Fund**

The Ministers' Discretionary Fund, for which we will receive donations on Christmas Eve, is the fund within our church that is used to help individuals and families with personal needs throughout the year. In the winter months, the need for fuel assistance is often critical, but there are all kinds of special needs that are handled with discretion by the ministers in all seasons. These might include partial rent assistance, help with an electric bill, a medical need, or countless other possibilities. Approximately \$30,000 was dispersed this year.

The Board of Missions gives money to the Ministers' Discretionary Fund each year out of their allocation from the operating budget. The Ladies Benevolent Society, using their profits from the annual White Elephant Sale, also contributes generously each year. Occasionally there are gifts from citizens within the wider community who hear about our work and want to be supportive, but the largest single collection comes in the form of the Christmas Eve offering.

The Rev. David W. Good serves as our Minister Emeritus. The Rev. Rebecca T. Crosby is our Minister for Haitian Outreach.

As 2022 draws to a close, we invite anyone who is able to make a donation of any amount to the annual stewardship campaign of our church. The work of this church is entirely funded by its members and friends. Additional gifts, at any time, are very much appreciated.
