The Annual Meeting of the Shoreline Soup Kitchens and Food Pantries (SSKP) will be held via zoom tomorrow night, Feb. 13, at 7 pm. We have many volunteers who work in our church's food pantry, managed by Audrey Brainerd and SSKP. Please email the church office for the link.

**Diaper Bank Saturday:** 48 babies and toddler's received diapers this past Saturday. Volunteers expressed concern that the cold weather, with some temperatures in the single digits, would hamper our guests ability to brave the elements. We are grateful we were able to serve these guests with diapers, food, and wipes in a warm hall to welcome them. Thank you for your continuing support.

**Turkey/Syria Earthquake Response:** Several members of our church have made initial gifts for emergency help in Northwest Syria and Turkey, where the February 6th earthquake has dealt a devastating blow to an area currently home to more than a million displaced Syrians. Our congregation has responded generously in the past year to disasters in Ukraine, Pakistan and Florida. And so we are sensitive to the fact that we have asked for help for emergencies several times in the recent past. But if you would like to help, please send a donation to the church by check made out to FCCOL with Earthquake relief in the memo line, and we will add your gift to the funds already collected.

Contributions will be forwarded to the IRC. The IRC is already at work in hospitals and mobile health and trauma units in response to this new tragedy. Having had a presence in this region for over ten years, they already have established partnerships with local relief organizations there.

Church World Service Blanket Drive: In July 2022, 300 fleece (lightweight) and 300 wool blankets were sent to Kentucky in response to flooding. To help people in Florida after hurricane IAN, 2,940 fleece and 4,250 wool blankets were distributed. Houston received wool blankets in December during the extreme cold. Each blanket costs only \$10. The Waste Land: An Ash Wednesday Reading: On Wednesday February 22nd, at 6:30 pm in the Meetinghouse, we'll mark the beginning of Lent with a complete reading of T.S. Eliot's modern poetic masterpiece, "The Waste Land." Written a little more than 100 years ago, it was published in 1922 amidst conditions not wholly unlike 2023, in the aftermath of a global pandemic and a catastrophic war. Eliot's language depicts a shattered and barren land, in which people are searching for solace, and ultimately, for the waters of life. It is one of the great pillars of modern literature, and serves as a fitting way to begin the journey into Lent. Following the reading, ashes will be given to all who wish.
