We thank you for worshipping with us. It is a privilege to welcome Professor Peter Hawkins to Old Lyme this morning. Peter will be our preacher for the morning, and following the service, he will lead us in a forum on Dante's Divine Comedy, in particular The Inferno, helping us to prepare for our Holy Week reading of the poem. Peter's list of accolades is long, but suffice to say that for nearly 50 years, Peter has walked students through the Comedy (which consists of the Inferno, the Purgatorio, and the Paradiso). He has helped generations of students unlock the wisdom and power of Dante for contemporary readers. He is the author of numerous books, including Dante's Testaments, Dante: A Brief History, Undiscovered Country and a series of edited volumes entitled Listening for God: Contemporary Literature and the Life of Faith. In 2008, he was invited to give the Beecher Lectures at Yale, the preeminent lecture series on preaching in the United States. It is a great honor to have Peter visit this morning.
