Mission Outreach at The First Congregational Church of Old Lyme in 2023

This evening's offering will be used to support the Minister's Discretionary Fund of the First Congregational Church. This fund is used to support individuals and families in need. Over the course of the past year this fund has dispersed a little over \$39,000. It is supported by this church's annual budget, by occasional special donations in memory of a loved one, and, **most importantly**, by the annual Christmas Eve collection. We ask that you give as generously as you can.

The past several years have been challenging. Many families have endured, and continue to endure, unprecedented hardships. And some of the organizations which our church community has traditionally supported have struggled financially as well. But the extraordinary generosity of this congregation has made it possible for our Board of Missions to give \$72,000 of critically needed support to agencies within our region and throughout some of the most needy parts of the world.

In the past year, our Ladies Benevolent Society donated an additional \$38,000 to agencies in this region. This money was raised mainly through their annual White Elephant Sale; a courageous undertaking that gathers in many volunteers (as well as donors) throughout our area.

Additionally, in 2023, special gifts totaling more than \$193,000 were made by our members and friends to our refugee resettlement work, our Saturday morning food pantry and its monthly diaper initiative, the One Great Hour of Sharing work of the United Church of Christ, the Witness Stones Project of Old Lyme, the Minister's Discretionary Fund, and more.

Thus, in total for the year 2023, over \$231,000 in aid and support was made possible through the generosity of the people of this church.
