

Important Church-Wide Survey:

As many of you may already know, our church has entered into a consulting engagement with a company called Convergence.

The purpose of this initiative is to have them help us plot a course for the future that will keep us vibrant and growing in the face of nation-wide changes in the church experience for many. Convergence has deep experience in advising churches like ours, and they have a broad nation-wide perspective.

The first step in this process is to conduct a church-wide survey that will give our consultants (and us) a clear picture of our church as it is today. And, the more members and friends who participate, the more valuable and productive our work with convergence will be.

Southeast CT's Faith-Based Organizing Group in 2025

For two and a half years, sixteen Churches in Southeast Connecticut have been meeting to build a faith-based organizing community. The organizing group has named itself *Interfaith Covenant Initiative* (ICI).

Steve and Laura have participated in the ICI meetings, and most recently Susan Switzer has joined, too. Also, back in January, six FCCOL members participated in the 90-minute orientation to learn about this form of faith-based organizing.

What's unique about this type of organizing is that it's grounded in relationship building. Through one-on-one meetings people come together and share their life experiences. They share their struggles and triumphs, fears and hopes, joys and concerns. People learn how similar they are regardless of how we present on the outside. And from such exchanges, common issues of humanity surface. THEN, from that place, a community organizes around any issues that have emerged. It's inside-out kind of organizing versus an outside-in model.

FCCOL has already begun to quietly engage in this model. Throughout 2024, FCCOL members were invited to participate in one-on-one meetings with other worshippers in the Church - our Sacred Bowl conversations. It's a practice we'll be continuing throughout this coming year, as a way of building a deeper relational community at FCCOL.

It's our hope that we get a dozen people to attend one of the October 90-Minute Orientation Sessions, and from that, a core group develops who are willing to go further with one of the Leadership Institutes.
