### **Mark 9:2-11 (NRSVUE)**

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling bright, such as no one on earth could brighten them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!"

Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead could mean.

The Way of the Cross: From February 14-21, clergy and leaders from African American congregations have organized a March to demand an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. The March will begin on Ash Wednesday, when people of faith have historically received ashes in the shape of a cross upon their foreheads, a commitment to follow Jesus toward Jerusalem during Lent. That will take on new meaning this year, as the March commences that day at Independence Hall in Philadelphia. It will conclude a week later in Washington, D.C, proceeding in stages day by day. There is an open call for all of those who are committed to human rights for Palestinians to attend, or to otherwise support the effort. The ministers are exploring this opportunity, and are making plans to attend at least part of the March. Further details and information can be found at pilgrimageforpeace.org. Dante Returns! The Preparation Begins on Sunday, February 25, at 11:30am in the Sheffield Auditorium with a lecture from Prof. Peter Hawkins, professor emeritus of religion and literature at Yale Divinity School. While he is unable to be with us in person, he will be offering a presentation via Zoom. As he did last year, Peter will help us to understand the contours of the Purgatorio, and to connect it to our own lived experiences. We will have the opportunity at that time to sign up to be readers of individual cantos on Maundy Thursday.

On Maundy Thursday, March 28th, we will continue our exploration of Dante's *Divine Comedy*, making the arduous ascent up Mt. Purgatory. Beginning at 7 PM, and continuing until we're done, we'll read the entirety of the *Purgatorio* canto by canto.
