

The Way of the Cross: From February 14-21, clergy and leaders from African American congregations have organized a March to demand an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. The March will begin on Ash Wednesday, when people of faith have historically received ashes in the shape of a cross upon their foreheads, a commitment to follow Jesus toward Jerusalem during Lent. That will take on new meaning this year, as the March commences that day at Independence Hall in Philadelphia. It will conclude a week later in Washington, D.C, proceeding in stages day by day. There is an open call for all of those who are committed to human rights for Palestinians to attend, or to otherwise support the effort. The ministers are exploring this opportunity, and are making plans to attend at least part of the March. Further details and information can be found at pilgrimageforpeace.org. Stay tuned for more information as we learn what this might entail.



# **Scripture Readings**

**Exodus 20: 18-21** 

When all the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the sound of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking, they were afraid and trembled and stood at a distance 19 and said to Moses, "You speak to us, and we will listen, but do not let God speak to us, lest we die." 20 Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid, for God has come only to test you and to put the fear of him upon you so that you do not sin." 21 Then the people stood at a distance, while Moses drew near to the thick darkness where God was.

### John 1: 1-9

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being.
