We can hear Jesus say:



Scripture Readings

Mark 1: 9-13

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tested by Satan, and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on him.

Then Jesus, in the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding region. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

Lenten Meditation: Wednesday, March 12th, 6:30-7:30 pm in the meetinghouse. Praying with Art: The Stations of the Cross and the Solentamine Community in Nicaragua.

Join us for quiet meditation on the paintings from the Solentamine Community in Nicaragua depicting the Stations of the Cross. We'll begin at 6:30 with "Visio Divina," (Latin for "divine seeing)," a form of meditative awareness and prayer using the paintings as a way to see with the eyes of our hearts. After a brief opening, participants are welcome to take their time with the paintings at their own pace.

Church World Service Blanket Drive: The heavyweight blankets are distributed to warming shelters, to people who have lost their jobs and live outside in the cold. Immigrants who arrive with nothing appreciate blankets and "welcome backpacks". Donations for blankets are urgently needed for the many disasters happening in countless areas of the country. Saturday, March 22nd: Sharing Humanity Night (Formerly "Box Night") **4:00 pm arrive and set up boxes/tents**. Our middle and high schoolers are invited to sleep overnight on the church lawn and also host a guest who will share their experience of being without shelter. We'll assemble toiletry kits for the Homeless Hospitality Center, share a meal and watch a movie together. The next morning, we'll have breakfast and attend church at 10:00 am to share our experience during the service. Our schedule: 4:00 pm arrive and set up boxes or tents. At 5:00 pm we will listen to a presentation by a guest who is experiencing or has experienced living without a home of their own, following that there will be time for questions and answers. At 6:30 pm help put together Blessing Bags for the Homeless Hospitality Center. Please bring donations of small toiletries, women's hygiene products, toothbrushes, floss, toothpaste, and socks. At 8:00 pm we will watch a movie, at 10:00 pm lights out. At 7:00 am wake up and wash in the bathroom, get dressed, brush teeth. At 8:00 am our youth will eat breakfast and write reflections of the experience. At the10:00 am Church Service students will share their reflection of how it felt to walk in the footsteps of the unhoused.
