Luke 5: 17-26

One day while Jesus was teaching, people came from every village of Galilee, Judea and Jerusalem and were sitting around Jesus. Just then some friends came carrying a person who was on a stretcher. They were trying to bring the person to Jesus for healing but because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and let them down on the stretcher through the roof in front of Jesus.

Exploring St. John's Bible, *Thursday, June 5 at 11:00 am* at St. John's episcopal Church in Essex.

In the mid-1990's, plans were made by St. John's College and Abbey in Minnesota to produce the first illuminated Bible in 500 years. The text would all be handwritten (by the calligrapher to Queen Elizabeth), and the margins of the Bible would be filled with illustrations, and sometimes full works of art that spread across an entire page. Over the next 15 years or so, artists worked painstakingly to produce the St. John's Bible, seven oversized volumes, handbound, with precious metals used for the art. The original lives in Collegeville, MN. It is a stunning work of art.

299 facsimile "Heritage Editions" were also produced - exact reproductions of the original. And one of them lives just across the river, at the St. John's Episcopal Church in Essex. This coming Thursday, members and friends of FCCOL are invited to visit St. John's for a presentation on this exquisite work of sacred art. Text and image intermingle to fire the imagination, bringing the words and stories of the Bible to live in bold new ways.

Those who wish can meet at the church in Essex at 11 AM. Others can meet at FCCOL at 10:45 to drive across the river together. The presentation will last about an hour, after which we can find a place for lunch. We hope you can join us!
